Technical Excellence Scholarship

Scholarship recipients shall be two students who are nominated by CTE instructors and accumulate the most points because of their involvement in the seven following criteria:

1. Taking courses to qualify as a Career and Technical Education (CTE) Concentrator. The requirement to be identified as a CTE concentrator is defined as taking a minimum of three CTE courses within an identified career pathway; either all three courses must already be complete or the student must have completed two of the courses and be enrolled in the third course.
2. Participated in Wisconsin's Youth Apprenticeship Program under the supervision of the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development (DWD.) See http://dwd.wisconsin.gov/youthapprenticeship/program_info.htm
3. Participated in a Technical High School Diploma program as certified by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction(DPI) See <http://dpi.wi.gov/cte/resources/technical-education>
4. Participated in a Career and Technical Training pathway as defined by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) See http://cte.dpi.wi.gov/cte_cteskills
5. Participated in a Skills Standards Program offered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) (Examples include: Employability Skills Certificate, Youth Leadership Certificate, etc.) See <http://dpi.wi.gov/cte/skills-standards>
6. Completed (or on track to complete prior to graduation from high school) an industry-recognized certification program as approved under Wis. Stats. 115.367 (2) and in connection with the Act 59 CTE Incentive Grant. (Examples include, but not limited to: Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS), Assistant Childcare Teacher (ACCT), Infant Toddler, ProStart, Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), CPT Safety Module, CPT Manufacturing Processes & Production, National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF), etc.) See <https://dwd.wisconsin.gov/det/cteincentive/>
7. Participated in one or more of the Career & Technical Student Organizations (CTSO's) recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DECA, FBLA, FFA, HOSA, FCCLA, FFA, SkillsUSA). Students will need to get their current advisor's signature and fill out the CTSSO participation chart. See <http://dpi.wi.gov/hs/ctso>

In the event of a tie after applying the guidelines above, the following criteria will be used to determine the scholarship recipient:

1. Highest standard composite score on the ACT test.
2. Highest selection index percentile score on the PSAT Test.
3. Greatest number of credits earned in grade 9 through the first semester of grade 12.
