

MTSS Instructional Coach Position Description

AN MTSS INSTRUCTIONAL Coach:

- Reports to the Director of Teaching and Learning
- Supports the District's mission, vision, values, & goals
 - Clearly articulates the "why" and seeks clarification when the "why" is unclear
- Works with Director of Teaching and Learning to:
 - Research best practices in education and implement best practices in education
- Work within a district-level professional development plan to design and implement professional development including district in-service time, including summer institutes
- Provide on-going, job-embedded professional development to staff in a variety of settings (individual, team, grade-level, etc.)
- Collaborate with teachers and principals to analyze student data to inform classroom instruction
- Meet routinely with Principals to organize, analyze, reflect, and plan for school improvement
- Ensure fidelity of implementation of district initiatives
- Member of school MTSS Universal Team
 - Create and maintain district MTSS website with resources for teachers
 - Evaluate interventions and maintain list of research based, approved interventions for teams to choose from
 - Work with Gifted and Talented Coordinators to provide resources for students
 - Participate in intervention team meetings as appropriate
- Speaks with a consistent voice in delivering messages from the Director of Teaching and Learning
- Facilitates a clear decision-making process
- Establish and support lab classrooms in Waupaca
- Supports individuals and the team to maintain a safe environment for honest conversation
- Follow all Board of Education approved policies and all administrative guidelines
- Such other duties as may be determined by the administrative staff within parameters of the Teacher Handbook, Board of Education policies, state statutes, and administrative rules

An MTSS Instructional Coach is NOT:

- An administrator. Coaches will not be evaluating teachers.
- A teacher's assistant. Coaches will not be making copies for teachers, or running small groups for teachers.
- A substitute teacher. Coaches will not be asked to be a fill in substitute for a teacher when a position is open.

MTSS Instructional Coaches may be **REQUIRED** to attend or lead specific professional development opportunities during the summer (e.g. FIRST Institute in Fond du Lac on August 1st, 2nd, and 30th, and Institute).

MTSS Instructional Coach Contract:

• 200 day teacher contract (11 extended contract days to be worked during the summer)
