Communications:

District Administrator's Report:

Mr. Saari advised of the Community Safety Committee meetings that have been held and shared the Safety Referendum Informational Brochure. He also advised that two community informational meetings on the referendum have been scheduled – September 14 and October 13, both at 5:30 p.m., in the High School Performing Arts Center, and will be presented by the District's financial advisor, architects, and Administration. In addition, Mr. Saari advised that the next few Community Safety

Committee meetings will be held at each of the individual schools to look at the entrances and review the proposed renovations.

Mr. Saari provided an example of grant competition efforts made in order to grow the Waupaca area. The District is one of two finalists for the "Forward Together Waupaca: Relocation Campaign," with the goal being to create a brand strategy, including a landing webpage selling our District and community. Because of declining enrollment and employers in our area needing employees, it is important that we grow our community.

Mr. Saari outlined the many professional growth opportunities that staff have been participating in throughout the summer, which indicates how dedicated our staff is towards our students and District, and earning them some additional money. This is also a great investment by the District in our teachers who participated in the summer learning opportunities.

Mr. Saari also shared data relating to the educational job market in the District, state, as well as surrounding states. The data also indicated that there are more retirements than new teachers obtaining their licenses. Currently, the District has a 75% retention rate. He added it is a difficult market to hire teachers and that is why it is important to talk about culture, which we believe is one of the two top priorities along with mentoring, onboarding, and supporting staff.

Mr. Saari advised of the WASB Fall Region 7 meeting scheduled for October 6 in Neenah, and that it is an in-person only event this year.

Mr. Saari was excited to share that the School District of Waupaca was nominated by the Waupaca Foundry for the 2022 Excellence in Manufacturing/K-12 Partnership Award and we won! The Awards dinner is on October 25th at the Resch Center in Green Bay, and the District will receive \$500 for the CTE program.

Administration:

Procedure for Dealing with Intimidating, Harassing, or Threatening Letters or Communications: Because Board member Betty Manion brought to our attention last month a troubling communication, Administration felt it was necessary to have clear guidelines on how to handle intimidating, harassing, or threatening communications. Mr. Saari advised that legal counsel has reviewed and approved these guidelines. He pointed out that the District encourages civil discussion, debate, and constructive criticism, and emphasized that nothing in these guidelines is intended to limit in any way a person's protected First Amendment rights. Mr. Saari advised that this will be shared with all of our stakeholders and pertains to anyone who is an employee in the District. The District Office will keep track of all such communications, and will share with legal counsel and/or law enforcement if necessary.

Board Reports:

Discussion/Update on Filling the Board Vacancy:

Mr. Saari advised that currently we have received four applications for the Board vacancy and knows of a couple more who are considering applying. He shared that legal counsel advised that the District can run background checks on the candidates, and that the interviews must be held in open session, calling in one at a time for the interview. Following the interviews, the Board makes a decision.

Board President Johnson advised that depending on the number of applicants, we can do this in one special Board meeting on August 22nd; however, we will schedule a second special Board meeting for August 23, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. as an alternate date if needed.

Mr. Saari reminded the Board that they can come in anytime next week to review the applications.
